



GSA COVID-19 Family Commitment

In the interest of the health of our entire GSA community, we are asking that families commit to several safety guidelines to minimize the risk of transmission of COVID-19 at The Girls' School. If we work together, we can help to keep the GSA safe.

We request that each family read and agree to the following risk-reducing guidelines before sending their daughter to the GSA campus.

Masks will be required at all times while on campus. We offer guidelines for mask selection and mask wearing [here](#). Please ensure that your daughter arrives on campus wearing a mask and carrying several spares. She will also need a plastic zip-top bag to hold used masks.

Enhanced safety protocols will be required on the GSA campus. These include, but are not limited to, modified drop-off and pick-up procedures, temperature and symptom checks before and at drop-off, physical distancing, one way flow of pedestrian traffic, enhanced hygiene protocols (handwashing and sanitizing) and other practices to reduce the risk of COVID-19 spread at the GSA.

We need to partner with families to keep the campus safe and healthy. We will depend on families to complete [daily symptom screenings](#). Please inform the school and keep your daughter home if she displays any symptoms, if your daughter or any member of your family has been exposed to COVID-19, or if your daughter/family member has engaged in higher risk activities (see information below as a guide). Any time you keep your daughter home from campus she may engage in distance learning if she feels well enough.

While the risk of exposure cannot be completely mitigated, certain actions and behaviors can reduce the risk to our whole community. To keep our campus safe, it is essential that each family work together to protect one another. For example, avoiding enclosed spaces, groups of people, and activities that require deeper breathing (e.g. singing or exercising) reduces each person's risk profile.

We acknowledge that many activities are not included in the graphic and that some of the examples may not easily be applicable to all families.
