What to Expect

Thursday, March 28:

Monday, April 1:

Monday, April 8:

- ALL students will have the opportunity to experience the eclipse!
- *Optional*: Please send your child in her RED polo (instead of Monday white) for an enhanced viewing experience
- Leading up to the eclipse, our students will engage in activities and assignments to build knowledge that will enrich the experience and emphasize safety precautions. Activities will include: making a pinhole eclipse viewer craft with their Sister Groups, viewing a telescope projection, a video and safety instructions, an Oreo cookie moon
 - phases craft, and a post-eclipse Dance Party!
- We will provide all students with eclipse glasses and instructions on how to safely view the eclipse.
- If you are concerned about your child's eye safety, you may elect for early pick-up around noon.
- City officials anticipate a large increase of people and traffic in and around Austin. We recommend closely monitoring traffic conditions to plan your commute to and from school. Lower School students may be picked up any time after 2:30pm.
- We are monitoring the event closely alongside our county and state officials for any changes to our schedule. Safety of each member of our GSA community is paramount as we share this special educational experience together.
